

CSA RED FLAG VIOLATIONS!

Red Flag Violations are considered by the FMCSA as the worst violations a single driver could incur during an inspection. There are twelve (12) violations that are **Red Flag Violations**. It is important for motor carrier to be aware of these violations, because FMCSA investigators will always examine them during an investigation, They are also important when hiring new drivers. Be advised that the FMCSA highly targets and monitors companies who have hired drivers with **Red Flag Violations**.

Here is a list of the twelve (12) Red Flag Violations:

Basic	FMCSA	Violation Description
Driver Fitness	383.21	Operating a CMV with more than one driver's license
Driver Fitness	383.23(a)(2)	Operating a CMV without a valid CDL
Driver Fitness	383.51(a)	Driving a CMV while disqualified
Driver Fitness	383.91(a)	Operating a CMV with improper CDL group
Driver Fitness	391.11	Unqualified driver
Driver Fitness	391.11(b)(5)	Driver lacking valid license for type of vehicle operated
Driver Fitness	391.11(b)(7)	Driver disqualified from operating a CMV
Driver Fitness	391.15(a)	Driving a CMV while disqualified
Drug/Alcohol	392.4(a)	Driver uses or is in possession of drugs
Drug/Alcohol	392.5(a)	Possession/use/under the influence of alcohol less than 4 hours prior to duty
Fatigued Driving	395.13(d)	Driving after being declared out-of-service
Vehicle Maintenance	396.9(c)(2)	Operating an OOS vehicle
